The ACRN Perspective Series are academic, double blind peer reviewed, open access publications and conferences by the ACRN U. and partner universities.

Submissions will be blind reviewed to the highest standards, as we aim for an inclusion in the ABS quality list. All article abstracts are listed in the SSRN index, and are searchable through google scholar.

Typescript preparation

Articles need to be submitted via email to <u>submissions@acrn.eu</u> in <u>two</u> versions. One <u>without</u> any names of authors (for blind review), and one including names, titles and affiliations (!) of authors. Format in Word or RTF.

The subject line needs to include which journal/ special edition/ conference the submission is for!

- Word count should be in between 5000 and 20.000 (excluding tables and figures), on a total (including tables and figures) of 10 23 A4 pages.
- All papers should be written either in <u>UK or US English or German</u>
- Abstract at the beginning, as well as keywords must always be written in English!
- Please use 1,5 line space and Times New Roman 12 font.
- Please use three headline styles only, (14 bold, 12 bold and 12 italic) and use WORD headline formatting if possible.
- Tables and Figures must be included in the text, at the appropriate position, with Figure and Table numeration.
- Tables need to be formatted with thin single lines only, no colors. Table font: Times 10pt.

Details

- Title: as short as possible
- Abstract : between 100 and 180 words
- Keywords : approximately 8 words, separated by commas, all small caps
- Address including position, department, name of institution, postal and email address
- Biographical Notes: not necessary, but maximum of 150 words at the end of the file not in the blind version!

References

- Please use in text name and date short referencing style, with a detailed alphabetically sorted list at the end (!) of the paper.
- The complete style guidelines are those of the **APA 5th edition**, please follow style precisely!
- Avoid footnotes

• Full references should include all author's names and initials, date of publication, title of paper, title of publication (italics), volume and issue number (of a journal), publisher and location (books, conferences), page numbers.
